

FAQ's: Organic Pet Grass

What is Pet Grass? Freeman Herbs Organic Pet Grass consists of a blend of three cereal grains (wheat, oat, and barley). The life span of pet grass is generally 2-3 weeks if properly cared for.

Which animals can consume pet grass? Freeman Herbs Organic Pet grass can be enjoyed by cats, dogs, rabbits, birds, reptiles, and other small animals.

Indoor Pet Grass vs. Outdoor Grass? Freeman Herbs Organic Pet Grass contains many minerals and nutrients that outdoor grass does not such as: protein, vitamin A, vitamin K, folate (vitamin B9), enzymes, and powerful antioxidants. Our product is grown organically and is free from chemical pesticides, harmful sprays, and smog, unlike the grass found outdoors. In addition to being good for your pet's digestive tract, it is also a safe alternative to toxic houseplants.

How do I care for Freeman Herbs Organic Pet Grass? Our Organic Pet Grass can be watered twice per week or as needed. Do so by placing the plant in a shallow dish that contains an inch of water. Let the plant sit for 30 minutes to 1 hour. Remove plant and allow it to drain; this will avoid over-watering. Leaving the plant in water for an extended period of time will lead to rot in the root system. Let the soil dry before thoroughly watering again.

To keep your pet grass looking green and to encourage growth, place the plant in a bright location with indirect light.

Pet grass can be stored in a fridge or cooler when not being consumed by your pet. (Temps as low as 2°C) This will hold the growth of the plant. The grass may turn yellow because it has been deprived of light. Place it in a bright location with indirect light, and it will become green again.

Your pet grass can be trimmed when it is 5". Just trim the tops of the grass blades and sprinkle on your pet's food.

On occasion, mold can be found on the pet grass close to the soil. This occurs when the conditions of its environment are hot and humid. This type of mold, similar to what you may see on fruit or produce, is harmless. This can be rinsed off under hot (but not scalding) water and left out to dry.
